



#### **Before You Go**



### Youth Vaping Prevention: District 2 Health Educators reaching more students



Health-Idaho North Central District delivered the evidence-based <u>CATCH My Breath</u> curriculum to approximately 700 students (grades 5-12) in District 2, an increase from the 565 students taught in the previous year.

District 2's Health Educators, certified CATCH My Breath Community Trainers, taught the program at Kamiah Middle School, the elementary, middle, and high schools in Kooskia, Moscow Middle School, Timberline Middle School, Grangeville Elementary and Middle Schools, as well as Orofino Elementary.

#### Read the Idaho County Free Press article on Public Health at MVSD

In Idaho, 1 in 4 youth use e-cigarettes. According to the <u>2023 National Youth Tobacco</u> <u>Survey</u>, e-cigarettes were the most commonly used tobacco product among middle and high school students in the United States. The study also found a decline in tobacco use among high schoolers, driven by a drop in e-cigarette use. However, there was an increase in overall tobacco use among middle schoolers with no significant change observed for any individual tobacco product type, including e-cigarettes.

Several factors influence why a youth may start vaping, including curiosity, peer pressure, and the marketing strategies of e-cigarette companies. (<u>CDC: Why Youth Vape</u>)

CATCH My Breath is a free youth vaping prevention program aimed at assisting schools to counteract the increasing prevalence of youth vaping and substance misuse. The program includes age-suitable curricular materials, engaging lessons, and knowledgeable discussions, enabling educators to foster impactful conversations on this subject.
