Mike will provide an overview on tactical operations during an active shooter event and how they coordinate with EMS during an event.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Randy Arnold provided information on the changing roles of EMS during Active Shooter incidents • Defined roles for Law Enforcement, EMS and Fire can improve survival rate of victims during incidents • Planning, education and training together is important for response agencies • Paul Kwiatkowski provided details on two different Active Shooter incidents that occurred in Moscow • Communication and coordination between all responding agencies was an issue • Moscow PD will not put EMS at risk until they can confirm the scene is safe • Moscow PD works with Gritman Medical Center to plan for active shooter incidents • Mike Quintal explained that Grangeville PD plans for worst case scenarios in all trainings and exercises – Train for reality • Grangeville PD works on Active Shooter scenarios with local EMS, Fire and all other first responders • Mike encourages Unified Command during an incident to help with communication and coordination • Mike discussed different strategies on how Law Enforcement secures a scene and works with EMS to treat the injured
