<p>Welcome and updates on coalition progress since last meeting (10:00-10:45)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public Health update (Mike Larson) • Completion of Coalition Assessment Tool, NCHC Gaps List, NCHC Goals (Bill Spencer) • WebEOC NCHC Boards roll-out (Dean Neufeld) • Agency updates 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mike Larson gave an update on the current communicable disease season. Influenza H3N2 predominant strain and tapering off nationally as well as locally. RSV had a normal season. Pertussis is on the expected 5-year cycle rise. • The Coalition Assessment Tool is a federal guide to assess the coalition’s membership, governance documents, and overall capabilities for emergency preparedness, response, and planning. It was completed as baseline and will be completed annually to assess the coalition’s growth. • To identify goals for the coalition, a list of gaps identified from past coalition exercises was compiled. It will be available on the NCHC Documents WebEOC board. NCHC members are encouraged to use the list when designing exercises and trainings to address the gaps. • Dean Neufeld reviewed the NCHC WebEOC boards, including the resource list, event log, training & exercise calendar & a patient tracking system possibility. NCHC membership will continue to receive emails from WebEOC when events and training/ exercises are added.

<p>Dialysis Center Emergency Preparedness and Patient Support (11:10-11:30) (Joni Kelley and Dave Geyer, Lewis Clark Kidney Center)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Joni Kelley explained their dialysis patient emergency preparedness education, including modifying diet, emergency tubing disconnection, and information to find a dialysis facility when traveling. • Dave Geyer explained the facility's plans for functioning in disasters, including back-up water resources and power needs.
<p>Emergency response and obtaining medical supplies (11:30-11:45) (Shane Blamires, Norco)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shane Blamires explained their emergency plans for clients in the community on oxygen. They also use a client classification/ triage system to prioritize meeting clients' needs in a disaster.
<p>Ebola Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) preparedness (11:45-12:00) (Kim Monson)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Upcoming PPE train-the-trainer workshops March 21-22 • Communicating PPE supplies availability through the coalition • How to obtain PPE supplies through subgrant 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NETEC is providing PPE donning/ doffing workshops: March 21st at Kamiah Fire Station and March 22nd at Gritman Medical Center. • 1.5 hour pre-workshop Person Under Investigation online training required. • Please invite your agency's infection control and staff education leads. The target audience is EMS, ERs, ICUs, and anyone else that would potentially come in contact with a Person Under Investigation. • Workshop participants need to bring their own facility's PPE to practice with. • Participating agencies are eligible for training PPE replacement through Public Health. The contract with replacement instructions will be shared at the workshops. • See flyer for registration and details. Training is free and CEUs are provided for both the online and in-person portions.
<p>Use of disaster modeling for coordinating health and medical responses (12:30-1:30) (Dr. Kimberley Shoaf from University of Utah)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What is modeling and how does it help with public health and coalition emergency preparedness planning, coordination, and exercises? • Use of HAZUS, including injury classification model • Resource Allocation planning using quick assessments and modeling 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kim Shoaf explained the use of scientific disaster modeling in emergency hospital needs planning. • She demonstrated the Kaiser Permanente HVA tool and the UCLA HRAI to estimate the impact on the healthcare system. • She explained HAZUS models and injury classification. • Kim talked about using modeling for Just in Time Resource Allocation, planning resource needs for 4-10+ days, and using modeling in exercises that test resource allocation and emergency planning.
